1 Overall result of activity

With the COVID-19 pandemic that broke out in January 2020 finally coming to an end, the last fiscal year saw a gradual return of volunteers to support activities in Japan. With the cooperation of many supporters and volunteers, we were able to provide assistances in finding housing and improving the environment through cleaning and repair, to mainly elderly and disabled people living in Tokyo. In the spring, the GV (Global Village) program was resumed in two countries, and leadership training programs for young people were given in person. In addition, we conducted repair activities at 12 facilities, including children's homes. Through these activities, we have expanded the circle of partners who agree with the philosophy of the organization and the significance of its activities, as well as communicated to society at large a certain level about various housing-related issues and the importance of participation by civil society.
