Project Outline	From 28th June to 2nd July 2010, volunteers will join families to build 30 houses in Ulaanbaatar, the capital of Mongolia. The Blue Sky Build 2010 will also celebrate ten years of Habitat building in Mongolia, a decade that has seen more than 1,500 families enjoy transformed lives thanks to their new, safe and affordable Habitat homes. The Blue Sky Build 2010 will set the scene for the launch of a second decade with an ambitious campaign to significantly increase Habitat's reach. The new goal is to engage volunteers and donors to support the building of 1,000 more homes in just three years, by 2012.

Not Included in the Participation fee	The Participation fee does not include trip airfare; airport tax; travel insurance; private expenses (incl. R&R activities).

* 1 Deadline

- The application will be closed once the number of applicant reaches the maximum.

* 2 Lodging

- Volunteer's accommodation will be a shared room of 2-3 people. If you have some preferred roommates, please check the <Preferred roommate> column in the application form. Unless you do, Habitat will arrange it. However, even if you write it, it could be that we are not able to live up to your expectations.
- Please make a reservation by yourself if you would like to stay at Bayangol Hotel before/after the project.

* 3 Local Support

- Although HFH Japan's staff are not supposed to accompany the team from Japan, local staff and volunteers of HFH Mongolia will take care of all volunteers throughout the project. At the airport, all international volunteers will be picked up and brought to the hotel on the 26th, and 27th June. 2010. All volunteers will also be dropped off at the airport on the 3rd of July.

* 4 Cancellation Policy

① If individual volunteers must cancel...

Regardless of the timing, we cannot refund the registration deposit of ¥50,000 per volunteer. Cancellation 31-60 days prior to departure will result in a ¥10,000 cancellation fee per volunteer, in addition to the above mentioned ¥50,000 per volunteer. Cancellation within 30 days of departure will result in all of your payments being retained by Habitat for Humanity.

② If HABITAT FOR HUMANITY must cancel...

In case the safety condition worsens in the hosting country or community, Habitat for Humanity will ask the volunteer to cancel the trip and receive a refund. We cannot compensate you for any other expenses.

* 5 Insurance

- The insurance covers medical expenses incurred by diseases and injuries during the project. However, it does not cover baggage loss or flight delays. We recommend that you purchase your own overseas travel insurance.
